**IMPLEMENTATION OF 2024 NATIONAL LEARNING CAMP (NLC) AND OTHER
END OF SCHOOL YEAR (EOSY) ACTIVITIES**

1. As articulated in its MATATAG: Batang Makabansa, Bansang Makabata Agenda, and pursuant to DepEd Memorandum RE: Guidelines on the Utilization of 2024 Program Support Fund (PSF) to DepEd Regional Offices (ROs) for the Implementation of the National Learning Camp (NLC) and Other 2024 EOSY Break Activities in support to the National Recovery Program (NLRP), this Office implements the 2024 National Learning Camp (NLC) and other EOSY break activities to address learning gaps.
2. The 2024 National Learning Camp (NLC) shall target learners currently enrolled in Grades 1 to 3 with focus on improving Reading and Mathematics (RM) skills, and for Grades 7 to 10 giving emphasis on English, Science and Mathematics (ESM).
3. In support of the aforementioned activities and to ensure appropriate utilization of 2024 PSF funds, Item no. 7 of DepEd Memorandum stipulates the following.

3.1 The excess funds from the NLC PSF from 2023 General Management and Supervision-Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (GMS-MOOE) FY 2023 (R.A. 11936) Continuing Funds shall be used for the payment of meal expenses for DepEd Learning Camp Volunteers (LCVs) and/or remuneration for the non-DepEd LCVs and other eligible expenditures that form part of the operational expenses in the Implementation of the 2024 NLC EOSY Break Activities.



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3.2 The following are the general eligible expenditures and activities to be funded to support the implementation of the 2024 NLC and Other EOSY Break Activities, answer sheets and assessment tools for the learners. subject to the limitations of funds.

- a. **Printing/reproduction of teaching and learning resources including answer sheets and assessment tools for the learners.**
- b. **Payment of meal expenses for DepEd LCVs and/or remuneration of non-DepEd LCVs; and**
- c. **Expenses related to the conduct of orientation activities for implementation of the 2024 NLC.**

4. Relative to Item no. 3, the Bureau of Learning Delivery (BLD) limits the enrolment in the LIS enrolment of camp volunteers to only 15% of Grades 1 to 3 learners and 27% of Grades 7 to 10 learners, with the learners under the intervention camp as the priority. The implementation of 2024 National Learning Camp (NLC) and other EOSY activities of SDO Sorsogon shall focus on the following:

- 4.1 **Elementary schools shall offer a maximum of 2 intervention camps and accommodate 2 Learning Camp Volunteer teachers. (1 reading teacher and 1 mathematics teacher).**
- 4.2 **Secondary schools shall offer a maximum of 4 intervention camps, and 3 consolidation camps to be attended to by 7 Learning Camp Volunteer teachers (3- English, 3-Mathematics, 1- Science)**
- 4.3 **The PSDS/OIC-PSDS and the school heads of districts/ schools not offering NLC Camp are tasked to prorate the allocation to other schools within the district to maximize the allocation provided.**
- 4.4 **PSDSs and OIC-PSDSs shall submit the actual number of Learning Camp Volunteer teachers and learners per district. (See Enclosure attached)**

5. Expenses for meals of Learning Camp Volunteer Teacher shall be credited to his/ her personal ATM Account, while expenses for the printing/reproduction of teaching and learning resources and assessment tool and the conduct of teacher orientation shall be downloaded to schools Modified Disbursement Scheme (MDS) account. (Landbank Account)

6. Widest dissemination of and compliance with this Memorandum are earnestly enjoined.
