- 1. Anent to DepEd Regional Memorandum 786 s. 2023 re: Implementing Guidelines for the Project 6B: Bawat Batang Bicolano Bihasang Bumasa at Bumilang A Multi-Stakeholder Approach for Improving Literacy and Numeracy Skills of Learners and Division Memorandum 303 s. 2024: Project 6 Bs Year 2 Implementation in the Division of Sorsogon, this Office through the SGOD-SocMobNet in collaboration with the Curriculum Implementation Division (CID) shall conduct the Year 2 of Project 6B with key activities integrated from the program's objectives for strengthened and sufficient implementation.

- 4. The recipients of the program will be the learners from Grade 1 to Grade 12 who are needing remedial reading and numeracy instructions. The reading assessments that will be employed are based on the following recommendations: For Grade1-3, schools will use existing results of the Comprehensive Rapid Literacy Assessment (CRLA), for Grade 4-6 and secondary students, the use of the Literacy Diagnostic and Assessment Proficiency Tool (Lit DAPAT) which was already introduced in 2022 by the World Vision Development Foundation.







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- 5. The Department of Education SDO of Sorsogon complies with the Republic Act 10173, officially known as Data Privacy Act of 2012 (DPA) and is committed in protecting the privacy. During the course of this program, we will collect personal information for the purpose of documentation and verification of implementation.
