**DIVISION CELEBRATION OF THE NATIONAL ARTS' MONTH 2026: CALENDAR
OF ACTIVITIES AND ARTISTIC COMPETITIONS GUIDELINES**

1. This Office will spearhead the **Division Celebration of the National Arts Month 2026** with the theme “Ani ng Sining: Katotohanan at Giting” on February 1-28, 2026, at Bulwagan ng Karunungan, Schools Division Office of Sorsogon, Balogo Sports Complex, Balogo, Sorsogon City, and SM City Sorsogon
2. This aims to celebrate the National Arts Month under Presidential Declaration 683 of 1991. In addition, to announce the launching of the **2nd Division Painting Competition**, launching of the **1st Sorsogon Arts Website Competition**, **Kundiman Competition**, **Short Film Competition**, and the **Digital Media Upskilling Workshop**.
3. All participants along with the teacher-coaches for the student categories are expected to attend the activities. DepEd Association of Visual Artists of Sorsogon (D.A.V.A.S.) and identified TWG members will be in-charge of facilitating the conduct of the activity. Facilitators are expected to report to SDO Sorsogon at least 1 hours before the scheduled time. List of the facilitators is enclosed in this memorandum.
4. Meals and other expenses incurred by the program performers, D.A.V.A.S. and TWG members shall be chargeable against Division MOOE/local funds, while travel expenses shall be charged to their school/local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and procedures.



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5. Meals, travel, and other expenses incurred by the contestants and coaches shall be charged against school MOOE/local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and procedures.

Description	The 2nd Division Painting Competition is an event for visual artists across SDO Sorsogon, featuring original artworks that showcase creativity, critical thinking, and appreciation of local culture and heritage.
Criteria	1. Relevance and Cohesiveness of Concept – (30%) Assesses how well the artwork interprets a legend of the landmark/place the contestant is representing and how effectively its



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	<p>elements are organized to create unity and coherence.</p> <p>2. Creativity and Artistic Merit – (40%) Evaluates the originality and inventiveness of the idea, as well as the overall artistic quality of the artwork, including composition, balance, proportion, expressive value, and innovative use of artistic elements.</p> <p>3. Execution – (15%) Measures the level of skill, technique, craftsmanship, and precision demonstrated in creating the artwork.</p> <p>4. Visual Impact – (15%) Considers the overall aesthetic appeal, including color harmony, neatness, and the ability of the artwork to capture and sustain the viewer's attention.</p> <p>TOTAL – 100%.</p>
Prizes	Winners shall receive a cash prize and plaque of recognition while the non-winning finalists shall receive a consolation prize and a certificate.
Rules and Mechanics	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The competition is open to all interested learners and personnel of SDO Sorsogon and shall be composed of three (3) categories: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Elementary Category – elementary students (Grades 1 to 6) enrolled in SY 2025-2026 • Secondary Category – high school students (Grades 7 to 12) enrolled in SY 2025-2026 • Deped Personnel Category – all current employees (Teaching and Non-Teaching) of SDO Sorsogon who have artistic skills are encouraged to join the competition. 2. The grand winners of the 1st Division Painting Competition are 	



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no longer allowed to participate while the runners-up from the previous contest may still participate.

3. Each municipality shall send **one (1)** entry **per category**.
4. The Public School District Supervisors (**PSDSs**) shall determine their contest representatives and shall send the names to Division MAPEH Coordinator at the CID Office on or before January 28, 2026. Conduct of District/Municipal Elimination is in the PSDS's discretion.
5. All contestants and their coaches are required to attend the general orientation on **January 30, 2026**, at 8:00 – 11:30 AM at the Bulwagan ng Karunungan, 3rd Floor, SDO Sorsogon.
6. All contestants shall be given one week to make their screening pieces and submit not later than February 6, 2026 at the division office until 5pm.
7. Anchored on the national guidelines for the Pintahusay event under the Festival of Talents, this year's competition carries the theme "*Hagod at Debuho: Daan sa Pag-alam at Pagsasabuhay ng Kwentong Kulturang Sorsogonan.*"
8. Contestants in all three categories shall interpret a legend of a local landmark or of the municipality they represent through a painting masterpiece. Hence, they shall submit a copy of the literary piece they interpreted alongside their painting entries.
9. Screening entries must be painted on a $\frac{1}{4}$ illustration board (15x20 inches) using acrylic medium and in a landscape (horizontal) orientation. Materials to be used shall be charged against the school MOOE.
10. The artwork must be **representational** in form. Abstraction is not allowed.
11. Entry must **NOT** be **poster making-type**. Caricature/cartoon/anime-type characters are **strictly prohibited**.
12. The competition strictly adheres to copyright and intellectual property rights. **All entries must be original** and not copied from existing or patented works. Any concerns regarding the authenticity of a contestant's entry should be reported directly to the organizing team for verification and prompt action.
13. Top 10 finalists shall be selected during the elimination round and shall proceed to the final round.
14. Standard art materials such as 30x36-inch panel-type canvas and acrylic paints (blue, red, yellow, black, & white) shall be



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provided to the finalists by the schools division office.

15. The composition of the finalists' entry during the screening or qualifying round shall remain the same in the final round. The **addition or removal of any elements is strictly prohibited**. However, contestants are allowed to modify or enhance the color, execution, or style of their final piece.
16. Contestants shall submit their preliminary entry together with their final entry to the Division Office on or before **February 20, 2026, at 5:00 PM**.
17. Failure to submit on the given date and non-compliance of the contest requirements shall be grounds for disqualification.
18. All final entries shall be mounted for an art exhibition at SM City Sorsogon Events Center from February 23 to 27, 2026.
19. The final entries shall be judged on the morning of February 27, 2026 and the winners shall be announced during the closing program in the afternoon of the same day.
20. The finalists' final pieces shall then become a property of the Schools Division of Sorsogon and shall be displayed in the division's offices and facilities.
21. The decision of the judges is final and executory.

- Week 1 (Visual Arts): Upload art works featuring personalities behind the art.
- Week 2 (Performing): Post dance/play videos
- Week 3 (Literary/Media): Add essays/poems/short films
- Week 4: Culmination previews + visitor stats boost

31. Each category will be reviewed by the TWG every Friday of the week at 5:00 PM. Screen recordings will be conducted to ensure that no further alterations or edits are made.

32. Failure to feature the weekly categories is subject for disqualifications.

33. The competition strictly adheres to copyright and intellectual property rights. **All entries must be credited properly.** Any concerns regarding the authenticity of a contestant's entry should be reported directly to the organizing team for verification and prompt action.

34. The composition of the Municipal Website Development Team shall remain the same until the end of the competition. The **addition or removal of any members is strictly prohibited.**

35. Contestants shall submit their preliminary entry (QR Code) to the Division Office on or before **February 6, 2026, at 5:00 PM (via Google Drive).**

36. Failure to submit on the given date and non-compliance of the contest requirements shall be grounds for disqualification.

37. All entries shall be finalized before **February 25, 2026 05:00 PM.**

38. The final entries shall be judged on the morning of **February 28, 2026** and the winners shall be announced during the closing program in the afternoon of the same day.

39. The decision of the judges is final and executory.

The kundiman appeared as an art song around the end of the nineteenth century, and by the early twentieth century2. Each municipality shall send one (1) entry per category.3. The Public School District Supervisors (PSDSS) shall conduct a municipal elimination to select their official contest representatives and submit the contestants' names along with their chosen Kundiman pieces to the Technical Working Committee via Google Drive Link on or before



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February 6, 2026,

4. The contestant must sing an authentic Kundiman or Bicolano Kundiman. (a genuine, heartfelt love song from Bikol, sung in the Bikolano style and/or language, ***preserving local tradition and emotion.***)
5. The accompaniment must be in digital format (MP3 or MP4). The minus-one track should be submitted to the organizer by the deadline of February 6, 2026, via online submission through a Google Drive link.
6. Aside from their individual piece, contestants are required to be familiar with the designated production number, ensuring smooth participation in group or interlude performances.
7. All contestants will use the same microphone and volume.
8. Each performance, including entrance and exit, must not exceed 5 minutes. Exceeding the time limit will result in point deduction.
9. Contestants must wear cream-colored Filipiniana attire (Barong for males, Filipiniana dress for females).
10. Failure to submit on the given date and non-compliance of the contest requirements shall be grounds for disqualification.
11. The decision of the judges is final and executory

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Guidelines

Participant Eligibility and Team Composition

Participation is open to all Secondary School students within the Division of Sorsogon. Each competing team must consist of a minimum of five (5) and a maximum of fifteen (15) members. To ensure a professional production workflow, teams are required to fill specific roles including a scriptwriter, director, cameraman, video editor, production crew, and actors. Every team must be supervised by one official coach (teacher) to oversee the development of the project from the orientation phase through to the final awarding.

Technical Film Specifications

Entries must adhere to strict technical standards to ensure quality for the official screening at the SDO Sorsogon Bulwagan ng Karunungan. The film must have a total running time of at least ten (10) minutes but not exceeding fifteen (15) minutes, inclusive of opening and closing credits. To meet modern broadcast and screening standards, films should be rendered in **Full HD resolution (1920 x 1080 pixels)** with a standard **16:9 aspect ratio**. Audio must be clear and balanced, with all dialogues, ambient sounds, and music synchronized effectively. Final files should be submitted in **.MP4 or .MOV format** through the official online submission portal by February 16, 2026 on or before 11:59 p.m.

Thematic Content and Creative Execution

The narrative must be rooted in the theme **"Ani ng Sining: Katotohanan at Giting"**. Filmmakers are expected to "sketch" (debuho) the life of a Sorsoganon by interpreting local history, oral traditions, or lived experiences. This includes the creative use of Sorsogon's local colors. All entries must be original works, and any use of third-party intellectual property must comply with standard copyright protocols to ensure the integrity of the short films.

Evaluation and Recognition

Entries will undergo a rigorous judging process on February 20, 2026, based on a 100-point rubric. The primary weight is placed on **Story and Screenplay (30%)**, focusing on plot coherence and relevance to the theme, followed by **Direction and Visual Storytelling (20%)**. Technical merits including **Acting (15%)**, **Cinematography (15%)**, and **Sound/Editing (10%)** will also be assessed, with the final **10%** reserved for **Overall Impact and Audience Engagement**. Top 3 performing teams will be honored during the Awarding Ceremonies on February 27, 2026, receiving plaques of recognition and cash prizes from the allocated project fund. Special awards include: Best Director, Best Script, Best Cinematography, Best Actor in a Lead Role, Best Actor in a Supporting Role, Best Actress in a Lead Role, and Best Actress in a Supporting Role.
